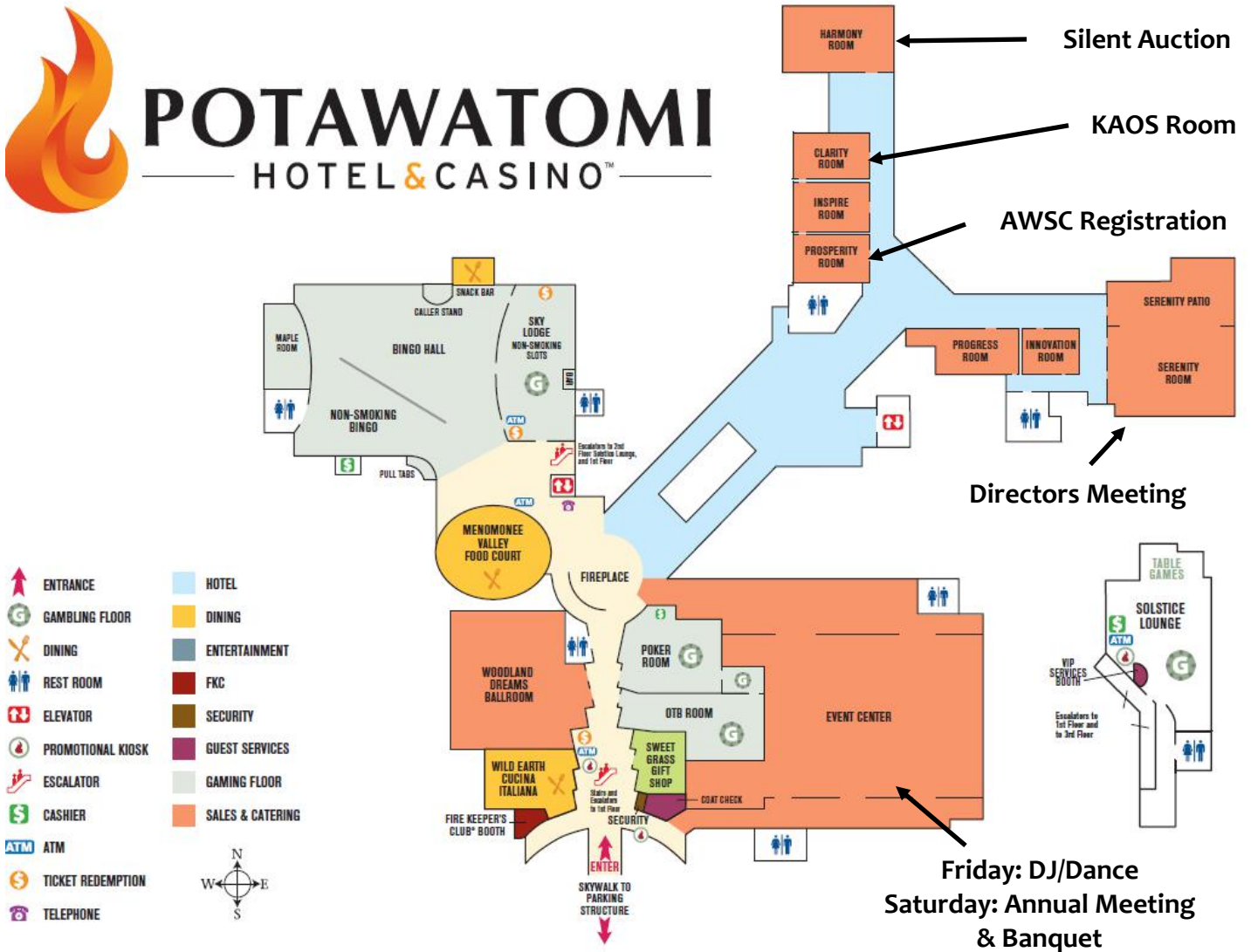

# Directional Map - Potawatomi Hotel & Casino

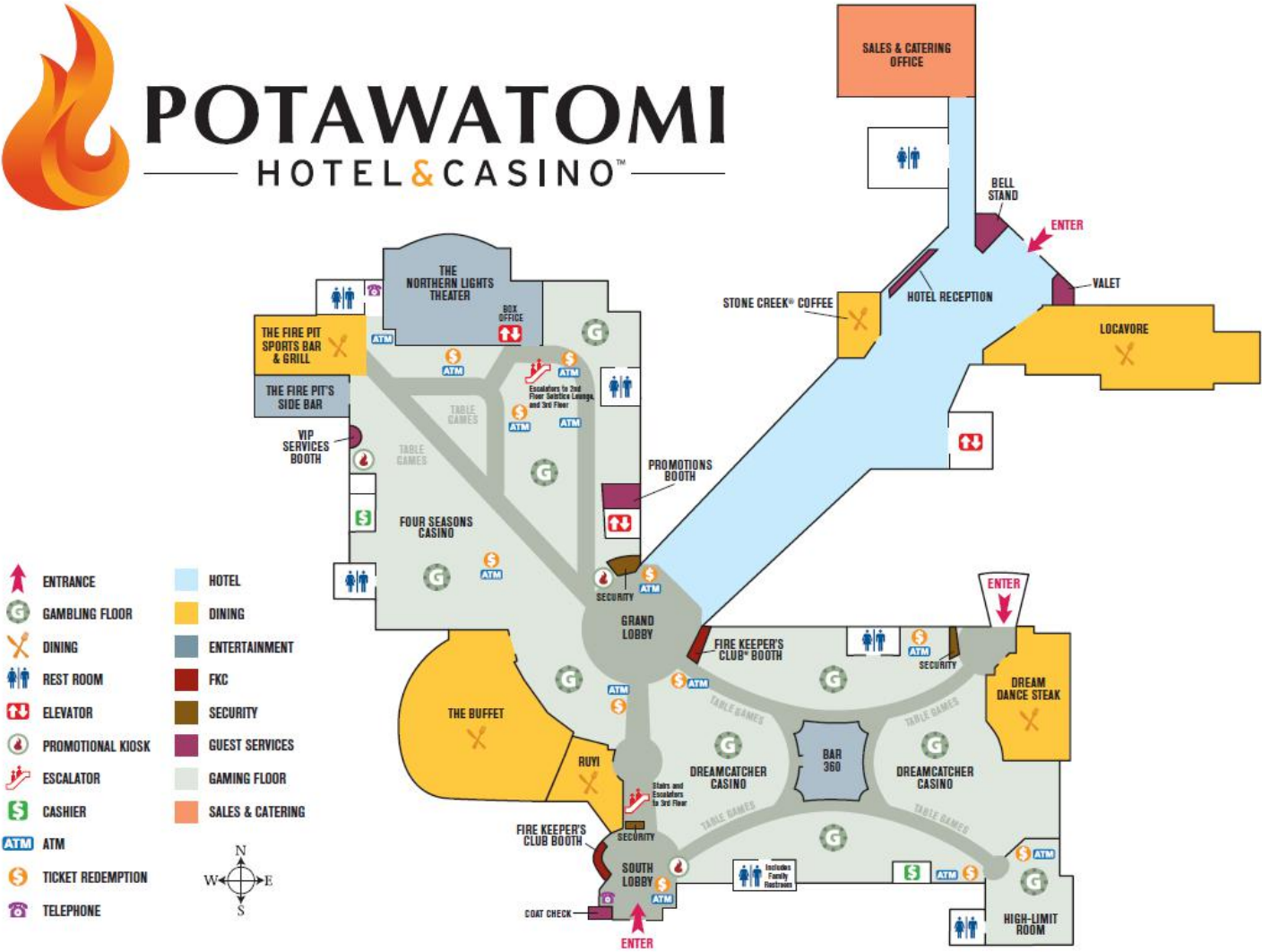

## AWSC Annual Meeting

March 19, 2016

Green Bay, Wisconsin

Meeting called to order by President Dave Newman

Military personnel and veterans recognized, followed by introduction of head table

Directors and Reps asked to stand for recognition. Past presidents asked to stand for recognition Dave asked to change the agenda to include recognition of retiring directors and reps, and a couple of other recognitions.

Section 1

Code of Conduct/Ethics

## Annual Meeting Minutes from March 19, 2016-Continued

The AWSC and its officers, directors, and employees must comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and fiduciary responsibilities in an effort to create transparency in all of our operations. The association expects that all officers, directors, and employees will perform their duties conscientiously, honestly and in accordance with the best interests of the organization. The AWSC will not condone the activities of officers, directors or employees who achieve results through violation of the law or unethical dealings.

### Section 2

#### Review of the conduct of an Officer or Executive Board Member

A review of inappropriate conduct of an officer or executive board member will take place at a regular or special board of directors meeting.

### Section 3

#### Removal of an Officer or Executive Board member

Upon completion of the review of the inappropriate conduct in question a vote may be taken to remove the officer or executive board member. A 75% majority of all board of directors present at a regular or special board of directors meeting will be required to remove an officer or executive board member.

### **Officer Reports**

#### Dave Newman - President -

Challenging year, first year of trail pass - went surprisingly smoothly, a few complains.

Lori and the office staff did a great job selling over 60,000 trail passes. We received a lot of compliments on how well the process worked. We will meet with the DNR shortly to make the process even better. We applied for a grant through ISMA, received a grant for \$4500 - used to work with a professional PR firm - earned a lot of media coverage that we didn't have to pay for - there are examples under "newsroom" on the AWSC website. There is information about how many trail passes were sold in your convention booklet. The Governor's Council will make the decision on how the money will be spent.

\$10 AWSC Passes sold – 61,966; \$30 DNR Passes Sold – 55,381. Total trail passes sold 117,347

Educate your new members; they don't know what we do or why we do it.

Contact the office if you have club events, and need banners and other publicity materials, we have them available.



## Annual Meeting Minutes from March 19, 2016-Continued

### Vice-President Lori Heideman -

She attended Women on Snow, the annual KAOS ride, those kids are awesome. Some have a lot of confidence, some didn't have so much when it started, but had a great deal more by the end of the weekend. They put on about 150 miles on sleds, did demonstration speeches, good weekend.

Attended the Governor's Council meeting, Celebrate Wisconsin Snowmobiling ride. We talk about fostering partnerships - lawmakers, tourism personnel, DNR personnel, media, snowmobiling industries. There were 7 legislators present, had a Trailside stop to talk to the legislators, explained where the funding comes from.

Attended the ACSA "VIP" ride - forest service personnel, public users - in Munising MI. More fostering partnerships on a federal level. Met and discussed over the snow budgets, economic impact, rode about 90 miles with this group. Talked about zero tolerance, safety, partnerships. Made a lot of contacts, important issues were discussed. She will be attending the DC Fly-in next month.

We have over 13,000 new members, the trail pass is working - grab those new members, get them engaged, get them excited. We have a way to educate them. Make them feel welcome at your meetings. Talk to them. Get them involved, exploit their talents. Listen to the younger members, respect them. Make sure your club functions are fun.

### Andy Malecki - Treasurer -

Represented the AWSC at the Military Ride in Eagle River, spearheaded by Col. Don Hamilton. The veterans enjoy the race, and then rode on Monday in sub-zero temperatures.

Andy thanks Lori Pohl and the Executive Board. This has been a new kind of year - good that we updated our software and phone system as the new trail pass program began. The people in our office have done an incredible job this year, it has been extremely busy. There have been a few glitches in the program, but overall the program is working. Thanks to everyone for supporting us.

### Sue Smedegard - Secretary

Who is here for the first time? Club officers? Trail workers/groomers? Do you know your county director and rep? The office staff is really happy it's spring! Before calling the office, please check the AWSC website, and call your club officers, your county directors and reps first. Membership chairs, please remember a computer doesn't enter your memberships when you send them in, even online. A human handles this stuff - please don't send in rosters multiple times per day. Remind your members that you are volunteers, also - you can't always enter memberships immediately. We don't want you to hold memberships, but please don't send them in multiple times in one day. They are your first line for questions and concerns. The office is overwhelmed with phone calls.

Sue attended the Wisconsin Governors Conference on Tourism on behalf of the AWSC - many in attendance were very impressed that we have the youth involved, and understand the importance of our partnership/relationship with Wisconsin Tourism.

Discussed the recent Celebrate Wisconsin Snowmobiling Ride (VIP ride) - well attended several legislators and department heads were there. This is applied for through the local Convention & Visitors Bureaus, with support from the local snowmobile clubs.

Social media is a great tool - be very careful what snowmobiling pictures you post, what you post is seen as the face of all snowmobilers. Use caution!



## Annual Meeting Minutes from March 19, 2016-Continued

### Sam Landes - Executive Director -

Dave explains that Sam's role is as the liaison between the directors and the executive board - this is not a paid position, he is a volunteer like all the rest of us

Thought the Bluemound State Park issue was resolved, and now two former DNR employees have filed a challenge to stop the 1.4 mile in a 1300 acre park. There will be more information to come.

Sam also attended Celebrate Wisconsin Snowmobiling - if you want to educate your legislator, get him/her on a sled. Get to know them, invite them to your meetings. One thing we did notice - Cathy Burrow has been great to work with, Ben Bergey was just named the new Park Director - he is a snowmobiler. There is a light at the end of the tunnel - there is some support in the DNR.

Make sure you are getting the funds you have coming. Check over your paperwork.

Sam has been surprised at how many people don't know who their assemblyman and senator are. Make sure you are communicating with your county director on issues.

Talk to your county Directors - they have a lot of the answers, as does the AWSC website.

We survived the first year - he was surprised how many people don't read their e-mails, magazine.

So many put off getting their trail passes until the last minute.

Gary Broderick from the New York association warned us what would happen. The clubs that are more professional, active, do a better job, get more new members.

Thanks to everyone for their efforts.

### DNR Representative Brigit Brown, State Trails Coordinator -

Many don't realize that there are 250 miles of snowmobile trails in state parks, and 950 miles on lineal trails.

Go Wild is active now - licenses will be sold differently, eventually snowmobile registration will be available electronically at a licensed vendor or online. Trail passes will not be added to this right now, will meet with the AWSC to figure out how to best make the trail pass work with the Go Wild system.

Motorized road access - legislation that passed in 2013, purpose is to recognize public access to department lands. Inventory and map all department roads and determine which are open to public motorized use. Will pilot with northern forests. Type in "Master Plans" on DNR website for further information on which roads will be open in those northern forest areas. You can sign up to be kept informed on the steps and stages in this process.

Fat tire bikes - sometimes on the same trails with the snowmobiles - there were some issues with them on snowmobile trails where they didn't have legal access. Working with Bicycle Federation of Wisconsin, hoping they will meet with AWSC leadership, increased communication to hopefully reduce the issues.

Roundabouts - she has started conversations with DOT to get this issue on their radar, issues with groomers crossing roundabouts is a real problem. Best way is to hear about situations we have had, DNR wants to hear about the issues we have - Don Mrotek can get the information to the DNR folks. How do we best modify the designs going forward to not inhibit recreational use?

## Annual Meeting Minutes from March 19, 2016-Continued

Contracts - snowmobile trails on DNR lands - park system land, working on revamping the contracts. There are 2 different forms - the land use agreement that allows trails to be constructed and remain on state lands, and the grooming agreement - maintenance money is not handled the same across the state. Want consistency and accountability, and increase communication.

Some administrative code changes are going to the legislature - to natural resources board on April 13 - package of tweaks to state laws including eliminating the list of uses on state trails. Was never meant to be a limited list of non-motorized uses.

A program where Parks, and grants, will provide equal funding to start the electronic reporting system - \$25,000 from each program. This is a long-standing idea from the snowmobile Rec council. Will shorten turn-around time on payments. This will compile and manage the information far more quickly.

Question about ATV's on snowmobile trails - have there been complaints? Yes, but in her years on this job, but compliments also. Positive feedback about sharing trails, some complaints. There is a county up north that has had complaints about shared use. Question - should there be a trail pass for AT-V's? Hasn't heard of anything - WATVA is going through a re-grouping, trying to figure out what their next moves will be.

Comment - new land use agreements, something to think about for clubs - surprised that it's a one year agreement rather than 5 or 10 years. They hesitate to put too much time or money into a trail with only a one year agreement. IT has always been the rule, just wasn't always adhered to - they are working on getting that changed.

Sam indicates it should get a sit-down meeting each year with the land manager.

Comment - with the "tweaks" to rails to trails or public trails, uses went to county boards and were written into the contracts - is the DNR going to put out information that the trails are open to public use, may violate those county contracts regarding usage. This re-write makes no changes, does not open trails to everything - eliminates the perception that motorized and non-listed uses can never be allowed. Some uses are already being allowed, change to administrative code won't affect or change any current usage, will still be a local decision.

Wants to eliminate the argument that everyone can be on the trails - hoping that statement can be included when the code is re-written.

Comment - new electronic paperwork is not working out in all counties. Nothing on winter ATV trail/funding, gets rejected - wants to go back to the old time sheets where everything can be entered. Brigit explains that the money being invested will be in the new program, not the one being tried now.

Question - will dealers that sell registration be able to sell trail passes, also? She thinks the answer will be yes, will check on that. Will get a receipt, and passes will be sent by the DNR.

## Annual Meeting Minutes from March 19, 2016-Continued

Question. Do clubs need to get landowner agreement signed annually, or is that just for the state lands? Just DNR land.

Rec officer stopped a lot of people from out of state that had the \$30 trail pass, but did not have Wisconsin registration. Also said club members got more trail passes than they had sleds and sold them. Dave said there couldn't be too many of those; the DNR caught many of them and rejected the orders.

Sheriff's department wants to display a trail pass on their sleds, but don't want to buy them (they are exempt) - DNR has struggled with that internally, discussion will continue.

If we go paperless, who will review? The county coordinators will still get the paperwork prior to submission to the DNR.

Question - why are we having registration AND trail pass - why can't they be combined into one? Was registration going to be eliminated? Some of it is the gas tax. Dave Newman explains that Trail pass is attached to membership - was never a conversation about eliminating registrations. Why can't we have something like a license plate, with a new sticker added annually? Brigit explains that the DNR is undergoing a comprehensive look at everything they do and why they do it. There may be some suggestions for changes to vehicle registration that come out of that. Dave indicates that we've brought this to Gary Eddy numerous times - the message we get is they want the trail pass sticker smaller, etc., was done similarly to non-resident trail passes in the past. If you are going to go to a sticker on a registration sticker - with 3 year registration, would have to figure out what to do about those in the middle of the cycle.

Doug Sessler asks if Gary Eddy is invited every spring and fall. Our biggest problem is enforcing the new laws. Second problem is informing the local law enforcement - they don't seem to know the new rules. As a groomer operator, he sees many sleds without trail passes or even registration. Dave indicates that the first year is resulting in a lot of warnings. Some of those without stickers may have had a receipt in their pocket. Sam said he heard from several Sheriff's Departments, DNR that they were out checking trail passes statewide.

Comment - online safety courses? Can't do online course until they're 16.

Callie Brice - Miss Snowflake -

Thanks all the clubs that have invited her to events. Her snowmobile and trail system in Wisconsin has treated her well this year! Thanks to the landowners, club members who maintain the trails. She attended the MS ride, the VIP ride, the Kay Johnson Memorial Ride, where she was accompanied by 5 past Miss Snowflakes. She thanks the program sponsors. Invite her to your events.

### Membership chairs - Jim Marks, Jim Chambers

Membership total last year 28,065, this year, we are at 41,554. Keep your club posters up; encouraging membership is a full time project.

December and January found half of the trail passes being purchased through the AWSC. DNR had the same issue. Please get your passes early next year!

### Old Business - none

New Business - Andy Malecki is the chair of the infrastructure committee of the Snowmobile Rec Council will discuss the automated groomer reporting system. First time the ATV and snowmobile people sat down together to discuss funding issues, specifically on trails used by both - had a request for 9" of gravel on a trail. There was discussion about who should be paying for what on the trails, have a better understanding of needs on both sides. The council entered an agreement with "Groomer Tracking Systems" to develop a pilot system. Four counties entered the pilot program. There were some glitches, got them remedied. There are still some things to work out. They will ask that counties number their trails, and by 2018 will ask counties to have their trails GPS'd to indicate what is funded and unfunded. Far in the future, GPS's may be put in the groomers, but not in the near future.

Question is will funding for this program come out of the trail pass money? Dave believes the motion was for up to \$40,000 to get the program set up, now hear the parks will pay \$25,000, money will come from segregated fund (includes trail passes, registration, gas tax)

Has anything been done about tracks on ATV's - don't qualify as an ATV or snowmobile - Dave explains that they do not meet the definition of either one. They cannot be registered as either in Wisconsin - can only be used on private property. Polaris engineered those machines for use in agriculture, construction, they were never meant for use on the trails.

Question - numbering of trails, what is the ultimate goal? Needed numbers instead of names for the automated reporting system.

Question - total number of registered snowmobiles right now? We won't have that until the end of June, last year was at 226,000.

Dave explained what the Governor's Snowmobile Rec Council is - 15 members (citizens of Wisconsin) - several members are in attendance, asked to stand for recognition.

## Annual Meeting Minutes from March 19, 2016-Continued

Question - legislature left without taking up a stand on the OWI legislation that was proposed. Knows the AWSC does not want to take a stand - will it come up again, do we want to take up a compromise on it? AB803 died without a committee hearing, session has ended for this year. Morris indicates that it probably will come up; it has come up for 10 years. It is political suicide for us to take a stand. Talk to your legislator, tell him/her your opinion of it as an individual.

Brown County was not involved in this convention, Jay Thompson and Kewaunee County are supporting it.

Comment - there are many unfunded trails, can the DNR do something to get these trails funded? Yes, that is one of the options. \$250 cap on maintenance could be increased, \$750 supplemental cap, labor rate, etc.

Comment - many clubs have had membership increases, and worker increases. We need to inform the new members about what we do, about landowner rights and procedures. Is there a certain way to mark trails legally? There is a signing guideline booklet from the DNR. Governor's Council Infrastructure Committee is looking over the signing guideline book and submitting suggestions to Gary Eddy.

A county rec officer was given a membership to the AWSC so they get the magazine and all information from the AWSC.

Comment - can we make these conventions fun again - music, dance. Bands are really expensive, no one has been taking advantage of them in recent past. Let us know what you want.

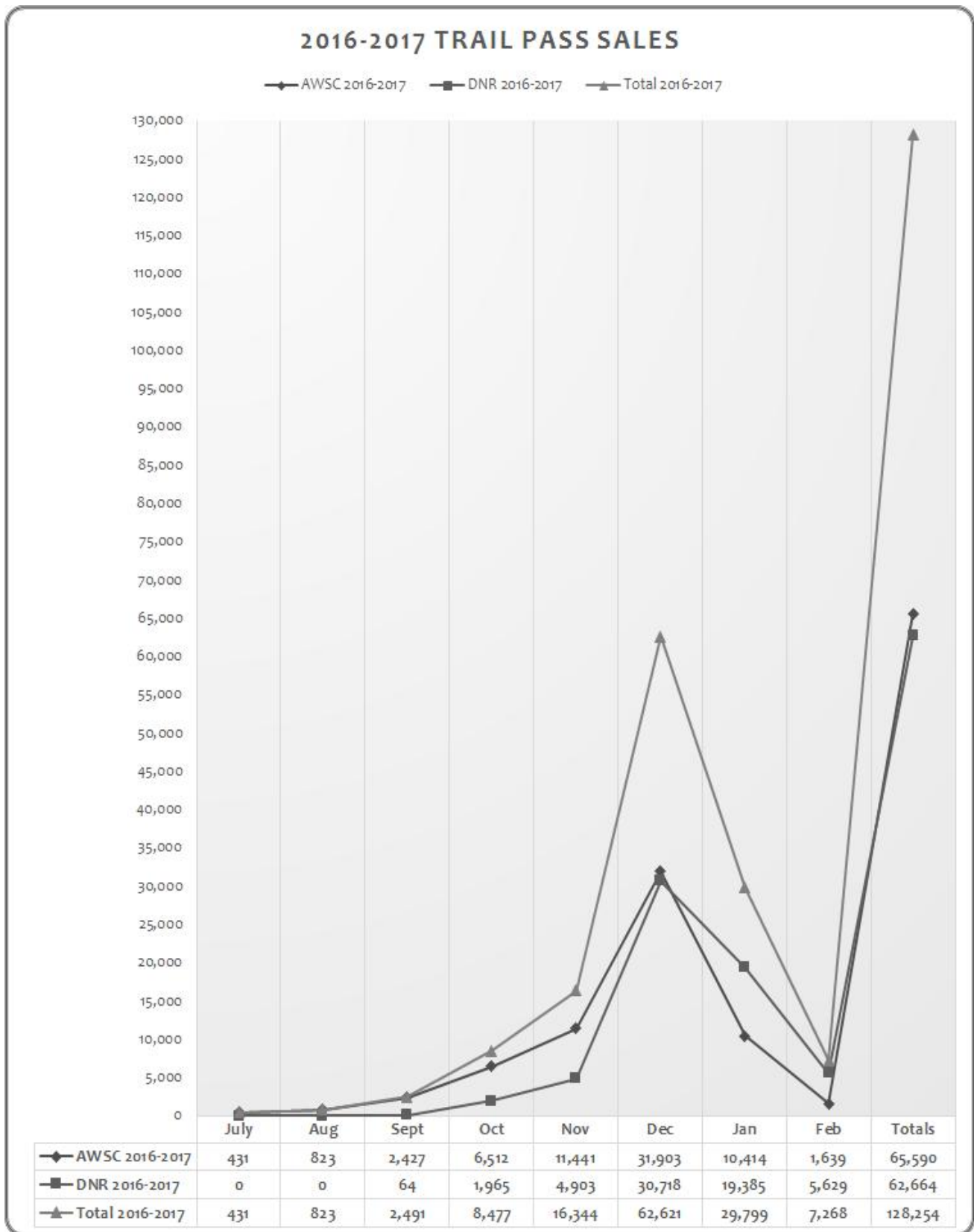

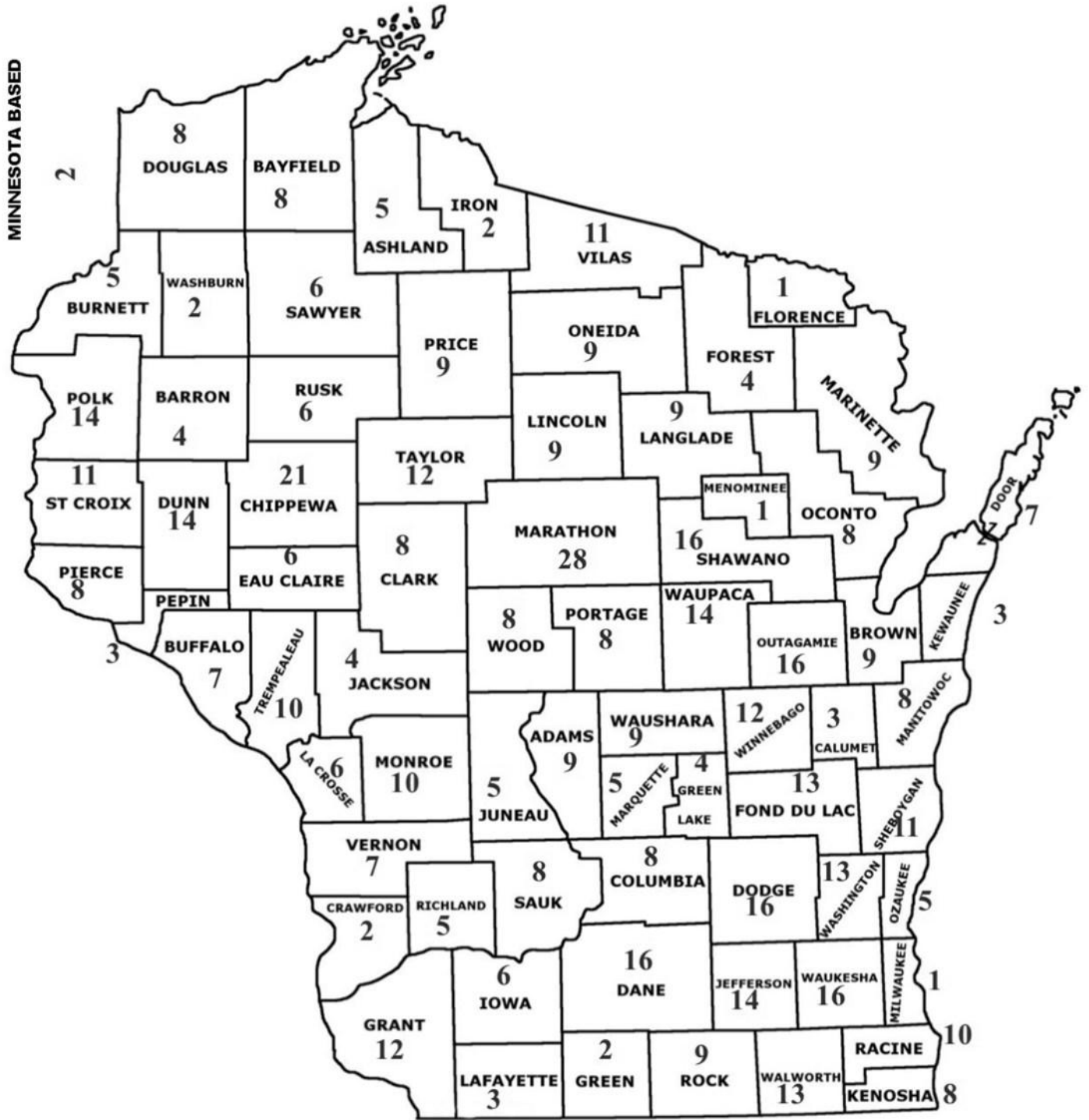
