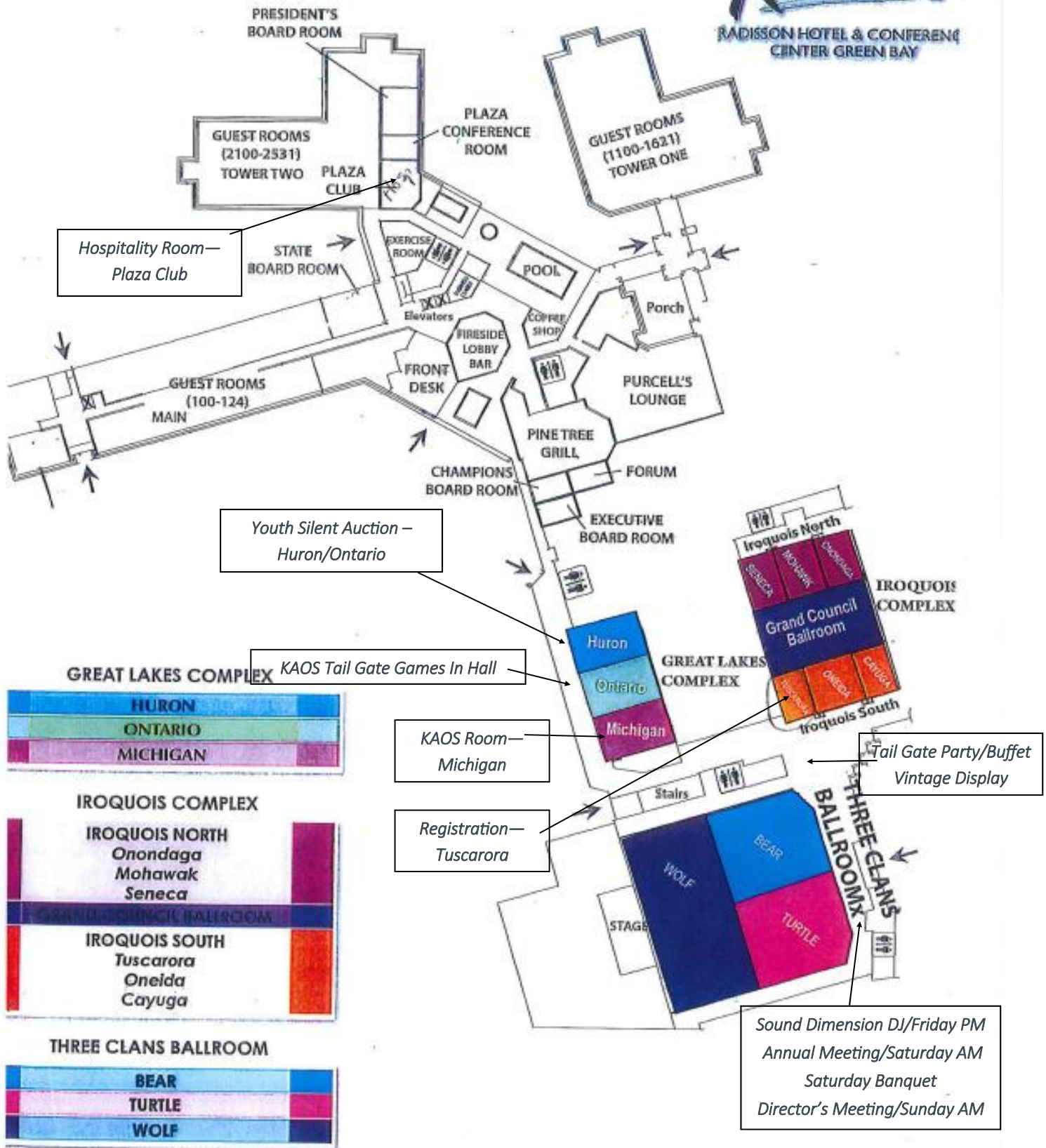

Annual Meeting Minutes from March 24, 2018- cont'd

Where does the money come from, and where does it go? Many aren't aware of the various funding sources or expenditures.

Registrations are at 232,265 currently.

Trail pass numbers (all passes) higher this year than last year.

SNARS - 3/4 done with effort to get grooming units correctly classed.

Question - There has been an excessive amount of off-trail riding - any way we can get the DNR to put a note - this trail pass gives you the right to ride on marked, open trails, off-trail riding will be considered trespassing.

Dave responds that we will meet with the DNR and bring that up.

AWSC Executive Officer Reports

President Dave Newman - Thanks to the office, Lori Pohl and office staff for a great job with trail passes and memberships being processed.

Most people seem to have trail passes on their sleds this year. SNARS program is required this year; you need to work with your county coordinator to get your paperwork submitted.

Snowmobile Rec Council met in Eagle River in conjunction with the VIP ride - all counties must have their trails GPS'd by April 15. 36 were in at last count. Need to get a handle on how many miles each county actually has, to determine what new miles can be funded.

Some grooming equipment isn't in the right category, that's being worked on. When purchasing new equipment, be sure you know the rates for that equipment before you buy it. Cathy Burrow or Gary Hilgendorf can help you with that if you need assistance.

Infrastructure subcommittee met this week, are making some recommendations to the council - some regarding Class 2 or Class 3 drags, set specs for fully tracked trucks, drags that have wings on them.

AWSC executive board members will again meet with DNR personnel

Trail passes being purchased for snowmobiles that do not belong to the member to give away or sell has been stopped by tying into the DNR database, worked with the DNR and Lori Pohl to take care of that problem. Better communication with club members is important.

Free death and dismemberment insurance through American Income Life has been discontinued, we were notified recently. As of May 11, it will no longer be available.

Conservation Congress Spring Hearings April 9 in each county, also county deer advisory hearings are going on now.

2019 will be AWSC's 50th anniversary - will be a special issue of Wisconsin Snowmobile News, Facts and History, also special events at convention, which will be held here in Green Bay March 22-24, 2019.

Question about the difference in registration numbers and trail pass numbers - some people in parts of the state didn't ride, so they didn't buy a trail pass, some on private property, some may have ridden without a trail pass.

Annual Meeting Minutes from March 24, 2018 - cont'd

Vice President - Lori Heideman - hopes everyone is learning something and taking it back to their clubs. Communication is important - tell your members where the money goes from the trail passes, etc. Educate your members. Keep your old members updated and new members informed. Tell people how the trail pass works, join clubs ahead of time, there is some process time needed from joining a club to getting a trail pass. Tell your members how to get their membership numbers, how to order the trail pass. Get your membership renewals in early, don't wait until late fall to send them in.

Trail pass is working - surge in membership, no new help? Engage your members. You have to ask them to help, communicate, keep your websites and facebook pages updated. Kids know how to use the technology, let them help you.

June 1 is deadline for "Of the Year" nominations - New category this year - Club of the Year. Winners in all categories are submitted to the national level.

KAOS leadership weekend was great, rode, learned about snowmobiling and leadership.

Snow Goer magazine - free money, the association gets \$5 per subscription – we got \$695 this year, we can do better.

Treasurer - Andy Malecki - Thanks for support in re-election. Thanks to Lori and office staff for getting the budget information together, will go over that with the Directors tomorrow.

ACSA - American Council of Snowmobile Association Raffle calendars - challenge was issued to sell more than Michigan - Michigan has sold 423 calendars, 507 were sold in Wisconsin. AWSC receives \$5 for each raffle calendar sold.

Secretary – Sue Smedegard - AWSC stickers - directors should have them, members are being told to contact their director to get them.

Social media - please be cautious about what you post - no stuck groomers, etc. People see that and believe we're tearing up the environment.

VIP ride - very successful event in Eagle River this year, 150 in attendance, 90 on the ride, will be held in Minocqua next year.

Tourism conference - reinforced what we've been saying for years - politics is local, get to know your elected officials, law enforcement, local leaders, be sure they know who you are.

Executive Director Sam Landes - Contracts with state for grooming and maintenance on state managed properties - asked that contracts be out by November 1. Number of miles should be on the contract. \$300 per mile should be on the contract - maintenance, signing and grooming, and reasonable brushing.

Directors and reps asked to stand for recognition.

Bluemounds State Park - 3rd time - public open house and master plan review coming again due to a lawsuit. Discussed Amery to Dresser trail issue.

On the legislative side - no bills that involved us this year that went through. Please remind people to pay attention and respond when something does come up.

Military Ride - over 115 military family members on the ride, 35 rentals and 37 other sleds. Thanks to the AWSC for the clubs and counties that donate to this ride. This ride educates and enhances snowmobiling. This was our 10th year.

Don presented the AWSC with a National Guard statue engraved to thank us for their support over the 10 years.

Has been working on updating our website, if you have issues or concerns about the website, let the office or executive board know, and he will work on that.

He will be working with Lori to come up with a concise, helpful, short statement to help members understand the trail pass. It will be available to add to your club website, facebook page, etc. Hopefully will minimize the phone calls and emails to the office.

Snowmobile Friendly Communities - based off ACSA program with several adaptations.

Program mirrors the mission statement of the AWSC. Don went over the basics of the program.

Miss Snowflake - Lynsey Burzinski - put on over 1900 miles riding this year. Thanks the groomer operators and clubs for the work on the trails. She gave an overview of the events she has participated in over the winter. Thanks all of the Miss Snowflake supporters. She has been contacted by youth across the state, did a Skype interview with a 3rd grader recently. Encourages clubs to have potential candidates run for Miss Snowflake, experience of a lifetime.

Send a postcard explaining that they are receiving this complimentary issue to make them aware of what we do. Dave replies that we cannot get that information from the DNR any longer.

Mike Holden - on behalf of scholarship committee, thanks for all that support. Also here to ask for additional support - we lost American Income Life scholarship, please continue donating auction items and add more if you can.

Asked about paddle tracks and the damage being done in Bayfield County - can we have a discussion to bring awareness to this? Will pass along to the Trails committee

Results of Vice-President election: Lori Heideman is our Vice President. Brian Swan moves to destroy ballots, second by Jim Drmolka, motion carries.

Comment that some trails are poorly marked in certain areas. We've been asked to have signing workshops, no one is willing to do them. Some counties have their own workshops on signing.

Snowmobile Rec Council is working on updating the signing handbook, also, should be available in the fall.

Snowmobile Friendly Community Awards will be presented at the Annual Meeting Saturday morning

SNOWMOBILE FRIENDLY COMMUNITY PROGRAM:

Early in 2017, the AWSC Executive Board created an ad hoc Committee and directed it to explore the feasibility of creating a Statewide Award/Recognition Program the AWSC could use to recognize and/or reward the volunteer efforts of its 600+ Clubs and the Communities they reside in. Although small, the new “Snowmobile Friendly Community Committee” went to work. Initially comprised of three Executive Board Members, one Club Member, and one Staff Member, the Committee held a few planning meetings where they reviewed a wide variety of ways to build a recognition program to meet the goals laid out by the Executive Board.

By 2018, the SFC Committee had finalized their Program and the AWSC formally announced and introduced the new “Snowmobile Friendly Community Program” to the Directors, Reps, and Clubs.

There are three main goals to the AWSC’s Snowmobile Friendly Community Program:

1. Create an Award: to recognize/thank the volunteers in the Club and Community who work tirelessly to support, preserve, and/or protect snowmobiling...(in short, no matter how large or small the community, award them with a sign/symbol celebrating the collective efforts of their local Trails)
2. Create a Tool to advocate for snowmobiling: The Award would be utilized by the Community, Club, or County to:
 - ◆ Account for and increase visibility of their Volunteers, (celebrate and motivate)
 - ◆ Improve relationships with their Community by/thru:
 - ◇ Engaging with key stakeholders (educate)
 - ◇ Partnerships, activities, and events (participate)
3. Create a Checklist For Success: The SFC Application is a Standardized Checklist or Guide Communities, Clubs, and County organizations can use to achieve success in four key areas:
 - ◆ Encouragement
 - ◆ Engineering
 - ◆ Education
 - ◆ Enforcement

Snowmobile Friendly Community Awards

CITY OF ALGOMA

Friendly Algoma has a lot to offer the winter sporting groups with snowmobile trails, cross country skiing and ice fishing. We have places that offer from burgers and fries to steak and the trimmings. We have Von Stiehl Winery that's open year round for tours and you can get to them all by snowmobile or car. We do have hotels that stay open year round. We are a small city, how small? We do NOT have any stop and go lights in our City. Which means we are small enough to say "Hello" to everybody!! So if you look to visit us, we are open year round with fishing on Lake Michigan!

Kewaunee County has 204 miles of snowmobile trails and the Algoma Snowriders Snowmobile Club takes care of 49 ½ miles of these.

CITY OF EAGLE RIVER

The Eagle River area truly exemplifies a Snowmobile Friendly Community. Our "community" is comprised of four local municipalities: The City of Eagle River, Town of Washington, Town of Lincoln, and Town of Cloverland. The Sno-Eagles has worked with each of these communities to develop relationships which promote snowmobiling in the Eagle River area.

The Sno-Eagles maintains a world-class snowmobile trail system with vehicle and trailer parking trail-side and access to snowmobile trails from city and town roads. All Sno-Eagles equipment is stored in structures on city-owned land and leased to the club at no cost. The Tomahawk Area is home to 400 miles of groomed snowmobile trails. There are historical markers to visit such as the B47 Crash Site. Check out scenic vistas and capture some photos of your group. Trails are well marked for ease of navigation and several locations offer gas for purchase. Plan a trip to Iron County and experience a unique snowmobile adventure that allows you the opportunity to unplug from the noise. Iron County -- THE Snow Capital of Wisconsin.

TOWN OF ST. GERMAIN

St. Germain is located in Vilas County between Minocqua and Eagle River and has always been a big supporter of snowmobiling. Our merchants, restaurants and motels/resorts appreciate snowmobilers to help keep our economy thriving during the winter months. St. Germain has abundant lodging establishments including motels, resorts and private homes to accommodate any group visiting our area. We are known for our warm breakfast cafés, inviting lunch stops and of course, world class supper clubs! For those who prefer to rent equipment, there are numerous locations to help the visitor gear up and hit the trails.

The Bo-Boen Snowmobile Club grooms 100 miles of trails daily during the season. We have three groomers that go out each evening for two shifts each. We receive many compliments on our trail system. Guest Speaker—Scott Eilertson



Scott Eilertson was born and raised in St Paul, MN. After graduating from North St Paul High School in 1973, Scott traveled across the US and Canada for three years performing multiple dare-devil acts as the “Evel Knievel of Snowmobiling.” Jumping things with a snowmobile the way Evel Knievel jumped motorcycles, Scott would jump anything he could get lined up. By 1976, Scott had perfected and was well known for his Towering Inferno Jump. Scott’s performances ultimately led to a call from Evel Knievel himself. Scott and Evel quickly became friends and performed together in 1977.

In 1978, Scott enlisted in the US Navy where he served for nine years. While stationed in Iceland in 1979, Scott organized Iceland’s “First-Ever” snowmobile race.

After separating from the US Navy in 1986, Scott came back to Minnesota and began working for Tousley Motorsports in Whitebear Lake. After starting in Sales, Scott quickly rose through the ranks at Tousley, to include serving as their General Manager for five years. While at Tousley, Scott began working on an idea he had to ride a snowmobile from Minnesota to Moscow, Russia. After a meeting with former Vice President Walter Mondale in 1987, the “Dream” was quickly becoming more than just an idea. Only two and a half years later – in 1990 - Scott Eilertson successfully completed his Minnesota to Moscow Snowmobile Expedition with two other Arctic Cat riders.

By 1998, Scott’s passion for snowmobiling led him to a position with Arctic Cat. From 1998-2017, Scott served as Arctic Cat’s District Sales Manager for multiple regions in Wisconsin, Minnesota, and Iowa until his retirement from Arctic Cat in 2018.

Scott and his wife Faith live in Hudson, WI. The Eilertson’s have three children: a daughter: Geneva, and two sons: Jacob and Ross.
