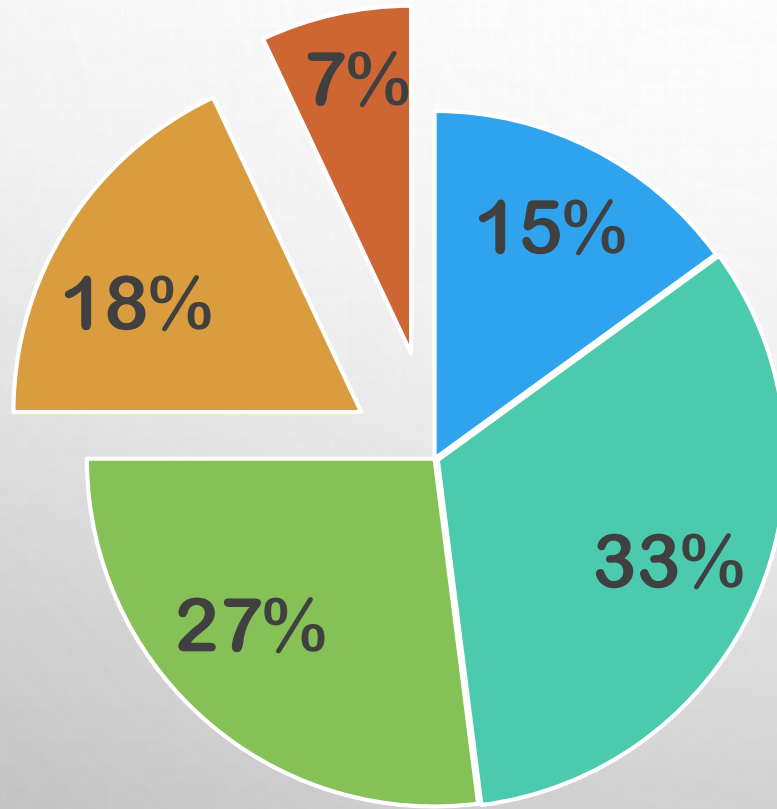

■ Gas Tax - 33%

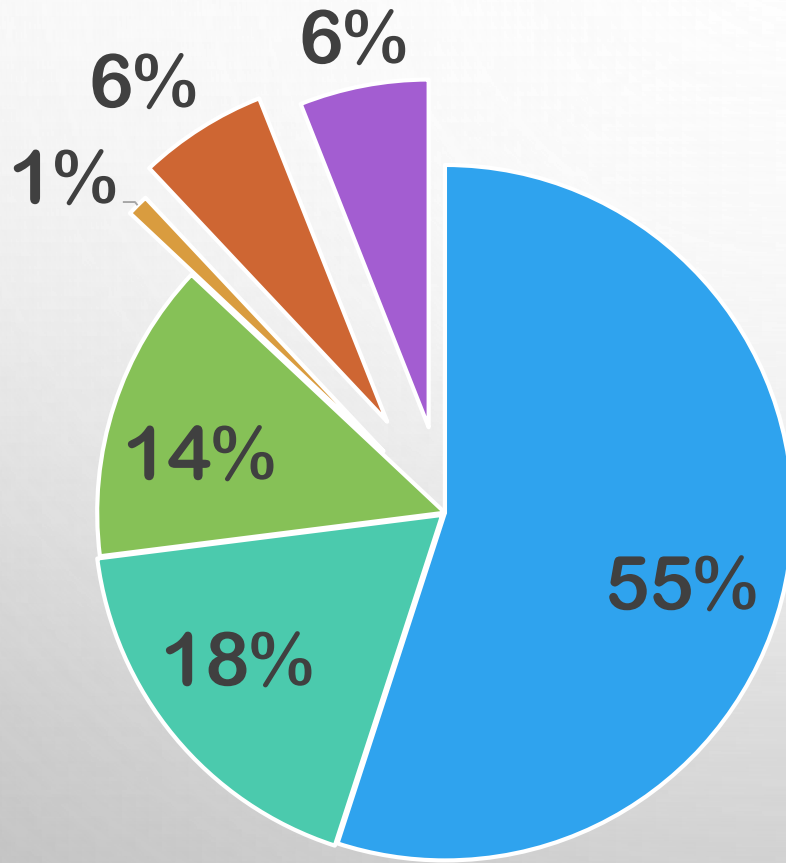

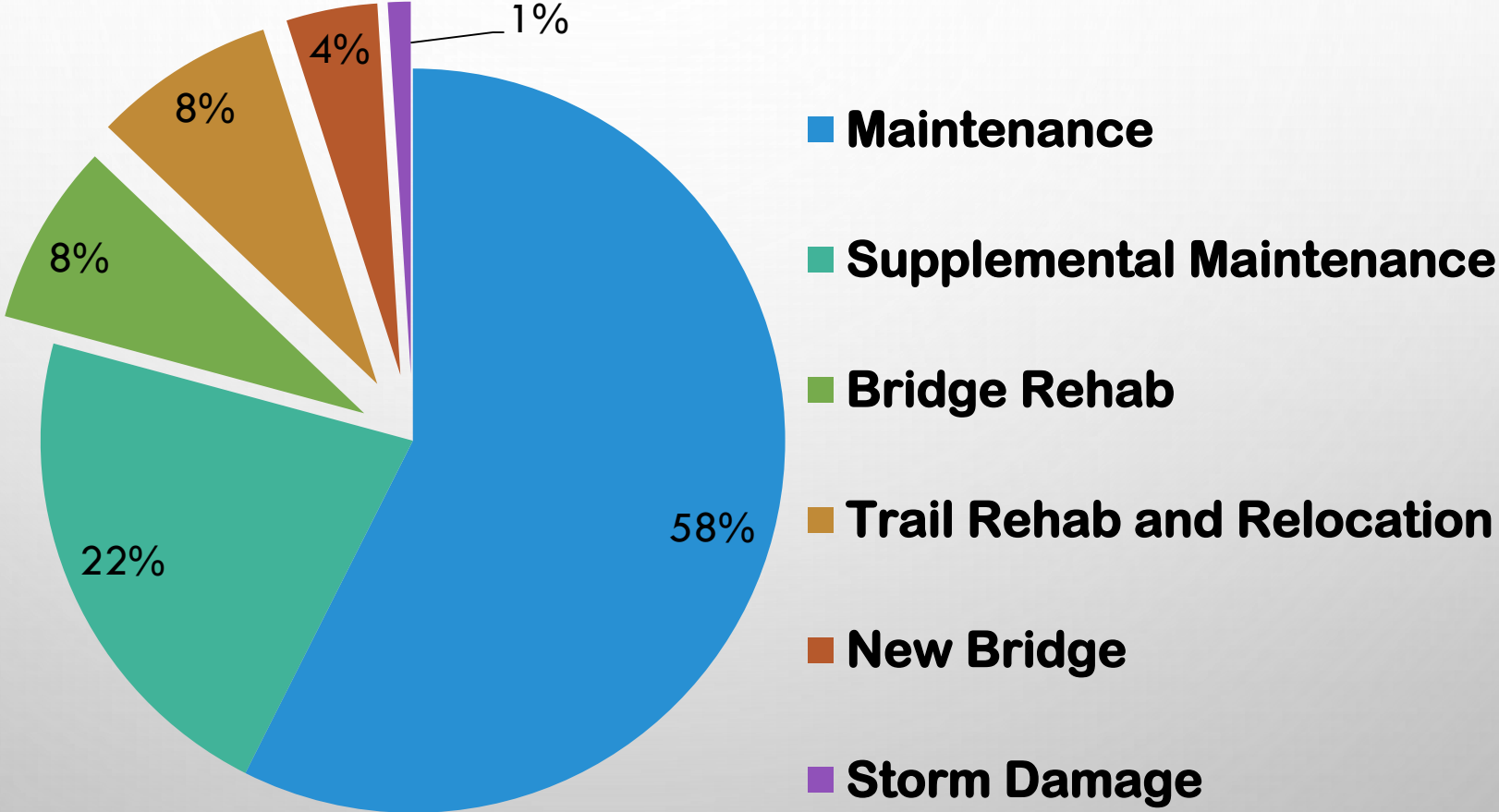
IN SNOWMOBILE SEASON 2017-2018

Snowmobile Recreation Council

Origin and Appointments: There is created in the department of natural resources a snowmobile recreational council consisting of 15 members nominated by the governor, and with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed for staggered 3-year terms. Commencing on July 1, 1972, ...all terms shall be for 3 years with 5 positions on the council to expire each year. At least 5 members of the council shall be from the territory north, and at least 5 members shall be from the territory south, of a line running east and west through the south limits of the city of Stevens Point. [s. 15.347\(7\), Wis. Stats. \[exit DNR\]](#)

Duties: (1) The snowmobile recreational council shall carry out studies and make recommendations to the legislature, governor, department of natural resources and department of transportation on all matters related to this chapter or otherwise affecting snowmobiles and snowmobiling. (2) The department shall prepare written minutes of each meeting of the snowmobile recreational council and shall make them available to any interested party upon request. [s. 350.14, Wis. Stats. \[exit DNR\]](#)

Snowmobile Trail Aids

Snowmobile trail aids are entirely funded by snowmobilers. The money awarded in grants to Wisconsin Counties comes from snowmobile registrations, trail pass revenue and gas tax from some of the gas used in snowmobiles.

These grants are used to reimburse the over 600 snowmobile clubs in Wisconsin for some of their expenses. Without these clubs, the trail system we enjoy would not be possible. The volunteer members provide the labor and equipment needed to develop and maintain the nearly 25,000 miles of interconnected snowmobile trails open to public use.

They talk to landowners to get permission to cross private property, work with public land managers, work with their county trail coordinator who administers the grant, brush & clear trails, put up signs in the fall & take them down in the spring, and spend many hours grooming the trails to make them safe and enjoyable.
