

Meeting called to order by President Dave Newman

Pledge of Allegiance recited

Recognition of military personnel and veterans

Moment of silence for Tom Chwala

568 registered for the weekend, 360 attending the banquet.

Introductions of head table

Thanks to Stormy Hovey and Lauren Sopha and Pam Sidwell along with Don Hamilton for putting this all together.

Directors and Reps asked to stand for recognition

Several members of the Snowmobile Recreation Council in attendance, asked to stand for recognition. The Snowmobile Recreation County met yesterday here in Green Bay and will participate in a panel discussion this afternoon

Agenda changes - election of officers was moved after the speakers, Dave will be giving Marty Stones report.

Motion to approve the minutes from 2018 by Doug Johnson, second Gary Hilgendorf, motion carries.

Introduction of DNR Secretary Preston Cole.

Secretary Cole discussed the importance of snowmobiling in Wisconsin. He talked about the economic impact of outdoor recreation. He encourages strengthening relationships with your tourism specialists, apply for the direct marketing grants. You're creating a better economy, not just for tourists, but your neighbors and friends. He discussed the importance of our relationship with the landowners. He thanked the volunteers in the room for all they do, including the 926 volunteer safety instructors - he asked for a show of hands of the safety instructors for recognition. He talked about the importance of safety on snowmobiles. He thanked Miss Snowflake AJ Kreager for going around the state and talking to kids about safety. How can we get the word out to the adults - a flyer with registration? With the hunting license? Preston.cole@Wisconsin.gov.

Dave comments that our partnership with the DNR is as good as it's ever been.

# Annual Meeting Minutes from March 26, 2022—Continued

Introduction of Jillian Steffes, Snowmobile Trail Aids Grant Manager

Jillian went over the trail pass history, strong sales this past season. Vehicle registration is solid, as well. She explained how the grant program works. A total of \$11 million was awarded for trail maintenance last year. We typically award about \$2 million for supplemental. New miles - 1400 miles have been approved in the past 3 years, north and south.

GTS units in groomers became mandatory this season, seems to have gone pretty well. Legislation - change of the 40; rule - trail still needs to be a trail, off the surface of the road, groomed 10-12 feet wide and signed. Road routes are still not eligible for funding. If you have a trail that is now eligible for funding, contact your local grant manager.

Dave Newman gave the report from Martin Stone, DNR Administrative Warden

Completed 2nd annual Think Smart before you Start campaign - weekend of January 21, rec wardens out - trails open in top half of the state, got wardens out on frozen bodies of water, great success, providing a presence and education, encouragement to operate safely and within their skill set, ride responsibly. Patrolled 2072 miles of trails. 15 snowmobilers were needing assistance, broken down, lost - 239 warnings issued for safety and registration violations, 71 citations issued. Wardens and officers have been distributing KT coupons for safe and responsible behavior. Safety messaging continues. Alcohol and speed continue to be the top contributing factors. Encourage to carry first aid kits, stay off frozen bodies of water, encouraging to stay on marked trails. Cutting corners, going up a hill is still trespassing.

Safety instructors - 926 certified, active

13,172 students obtained certification

In person classes - 20- 21 4700+ certified, in 2020, 3058, down from 4,208 in 2019.

#### Crash report

2021 13 fatalities, average victim 40 years of age, majority on public trails, 2 on frozen water, 3 on roadways. Alcohol and speed contributing factors.

Trying to get local wardens out on the trails, encourage people to slow down, stay on trails, ride responsibly. They sit with marked trucks at busy intersections/trailhead parking. Marking snowmobiles with conversation warden identification.

Drew Nussbaum, Regional Tourism Specialist - Everyone in this room is the epitome of collaboration, the reason the sport works in this state. He talked about the importance of respecting the landowners. Snow Report - thanked the 164 snow reporters in the state of Wisconsin, asked for a show of hands. Worked through the new website this year, and on March 8 reverted to the old website. Jeff Anderson and Drew have been the ones working on this and keeping it updated.

## Annual Meeting Minutes from March 26, 2022 - Continued

Secretary Sayers rode a little this winter, came away with a great appreciation of the sport of snowmobiling. He asked those involved in the Badger State Games event to stand for recognition.

Drew showed a 2 minute campaign coming out this summer to entice tourists to Wisconsin.

#### **Elections**

Jon Schoepke nominates Sue Smedegard as Secretary. Nominations were called 3 times. Hearing none, motion to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot was made by Doug Johnson, second by Holly Tomlanovich, motion carries.

Jason Grams nominates Lauren Levey as Treasurer. Nominations were called 3 times. Hearing none, motion to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot by John Stohr, second Dan Reinhardt, motion carries.

John Stohr nominates Lori Heideman as Vice President, Nominations called 3 times. Hearing none, motion to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot by Brian Swan, second Robert Crist, motion carries.

Joanne Smith nominates Dave Newman as President. Nominations called 3 times. Hearing none, a motion to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot by Gary Hilgendorf, second by Curt Christenson. Motion carries.

AWSC ByLaws Change - proposed changes were posted on the AWSC Website. Ballots were distributed to the registered voting delegates.

#### Officer reports

President Dave Newman - Legislation passed, Act 103, if you have trails that are now eligible for funding, you do need to apply. Trails need to be 10' off the traveled portion of the roadway, groomed and signed. Jillian discussed this legislation earlier. Illegal to operate with exhaust modified to make it louder.

We're considering legislation for this session, increase the amount of law enforcement funding, from \$396,000 to \$800,000 - we will work with the legislators, DNR to get this in the budget. Allow atv/utv/snowmobiles to be used as emergency vehicle.

Legislative trail caucus recently, represented motorized sports along with Randy Harden from WATVA. Lawsuit in Forest County, 2017 fatal accident involving their groomer, appeal was dismissed by the Court of Appeals.

Stower Seven Lake - lawsuit by Friends group against Polk County - Circuit Court denied the request for an injunction last week. Next hearing is in May.

Blue Mounds State Park - lawsuit filed by Friends Group - March 15 judge granted the state's motion to dismiss, the Friends are going to appeal.

# Annual Meeting Minutes from March 26, 2022—Continued

Signs on State Trails - we will work with the department as mentioned by Secretary Cole. GTS Trackers - for the most part, they worked well.

International Snowmobile Council Charity survey was sent to all clubs, due by April 15.

AWSC raffle - if you have tickets you won't sell, turn them in so someone else can sell them. Word of caution for clubs buying the raffle tickets - if your club isn't tax exempt, we'll have to withhold \$2500, and since you don't file a tax return, you won't get it back.

Snowmobile Safety Instructors There haven't been any recertification classes - safety certifications will expire April 1. Contact your areas outdoor skills trainer if you need assistance finding a recertification class or how to do it online.

Rode from Wausau to Eagle River, great coverage in print, tv, and social media for Badger State Games. Dave volunteered at the Clean Snowmobile Challenge in Eagle River recently. HE helped with the 100 mile endurance ride. UW Platteville took first place in the gas division and 3rd place in the diesel division.

American Council of Snowmobile Association held a snowmobile slogan contest, Steve Bethke from Sawyer County won. ACSA has an e-newsletter, you can sign up on their website. International Snowmobile Council will be held in Dubuque, Iowa in June.

Vice President Lori Heideman - welcomes everyone to Green Bay. Of the Year Awards due on June 15, information is on the website. We do charity work, community service, we need to get our names out there. AWSC forwards the winners to the national for club of the year. Wisconsin has done very well over the years.

Snowmobile Friendly Community awards - will be awarding 5 later this morning. Application is on the website. Scoring done by SWOT analysis, each on their own merit, not compared to the others. There will be a session at the fall workshop about applying for this designation. This is the year the first winners will have to renew their application - there is a different application for this. This has been featured on magazines, social media, newspapers.

KAOS - spent the weekend in February with them, Leadership ride, fantastic weekend with 18 KAOS members. Thanks to Oconto and Langlade Counties. She thanked everyone involved. Other states look to this group for how to form youth groups.

ISC is a great opportunity - Wisconsin has had the most participants the past 7 years. You can learn about snowmobiling at the national level, see what's done in other states, learn about ACSA and ISMA.

Keep an open mind, learn much today, take it back to your clubs.

Treasurer Lauren Levey - thanks for re-electing her, wants people to know her husband's grandma was a past president of the AWSC, Donna White. Now that she has a year under her belt, she'll be making a few changes. Reminds people to keep your club and county financial information off social media. We are working on the budget for 2022-2023, will be approving that tomorrow.

Asked the KAOS members and advisors to stand for recognition. Encouraged other young folks to join. AWSC.KAOS@gmail.com

Secretary Sue Smedegard – Thanks to clubs for re-electing her, happy to work with the clubs and membership again. Asked for a show of hands of those attending for the first time. Discussed the Snow Goer ad, information will come out from the International Snowmobile Congress, with a late July. deadline. Clubs should approve now if they don't meet in the summer. On your trail reports to Travel Wisconsin, be honest. If you embellish, riders won't trust the report and may not return to your area. Watch social media, many of those "official sites" have a lot of misinformation. Attended the Wisconsin Tourism Conference last week, happy to see Hayward nominated for being a Snowmobile Friendly Community. When you send your voting delegate forms in, be sure your delegate is planning to attend convention.

Executive Director Mike Holden - this is the time of year that most counties elect new directors/reps - welcome to all the new directors and reps. If you have any questions or problems, contact your director or rep first. If they don't know the answer, they can contact the executive board.

Many clubs turned 50 this year, asked for a show of hands. Congratulations to each of those.

Applications for projects are due to the DNR by April 15. Be sure your applications are complete or they'll be returned.

Congratulations to the northern clubs for a great job this year.

Trail signing - a number of clubs have gone to newer and bigger signs - geographic information in bigger letters on the top, and business information below. That's very helpful. Make sure you have signs at your intersections. If you have stop signs that are faded, replace them. That's a huge liability. Thank you for making Wisconsin the best snowmobile destination in the country.

By 2018, the SFC Committee finalized their program, and the AWSC formally introduced a new "Snowmobile Friendly Community Program" to the Directors, Reps, and Clubs at Fall Workshop.

There are three main components of the AWSC's Snowmobile Friendly Community Program:

- 1. Create a Recognition Award: to recognize/thank the dozens of volunteers in the Club and Community who work tirelessly to support, preserve, and protect snowmobiling...(in short, no matter how large or small the community, award them with a sign/symbol celebrating the collective efforts of their local Trails)
- 2. Create a Tool: to advocate for the preservation and protection of snowmobiling: The Community, Club, or County can use the SFC Award to:
  - Account for and increase visibility of their Volunteers, (celebrate and motivate)
  - Improve relationships with their Community by/thru:
    - ♦ Engaging with key stakeholders (educate)
    - ♦ Partnerships, activities, and events (participate)
- 3. Create a Checklist for Measurable Success: The SFC Application is also <u>Standardized Guide</u> for Clubs, Communities, and County organizations. When used as a Checklist, the SFC Program can help Clubs measure and guide their success in four key areas:
  - Encouragement
  - Engineering
  - Education
  - Enforcement

Both clubs work together, to make Three Lakes a popular destination for snowmobilers. 
